This is a view of the Lower Falls of the Yellowstone at midsummer sunset. It was painted from the original field study as an intermediate step to compose the scene into the form of a triptych. Afterwards, a scale model painted approximately ten feet in width was used to paint the mural at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City. In my opinion, this view from Artists Point on the Yellowstone is probably the most beautiful in North America.
